The deconstructionist masterpiece of Peter Eisenman is now twenty ones years old, and what better way to remember an old friend or make new friends over the than to pay a visit during the holidays, the welcome mat is out. The season is celebrated through, Six Solos an exhibit featuring the works of six rising international artists. Erwin Redl uses colorful LED lighting to create inviting exterior architectural environments that weaves together the exterior grid of the gallery and the Mershon Center. Inside the Wex, Gustavo Gudoy has created a white construction that emphases the more regular forms of the interior space.

Megan Geckler has brought new life to the entrance lobby, with colorful tape transforming a familiar space into a new dimension of perspective. The paintings of Katy Moran seem to sweep you in a whirl wind of color.
